## 1. Feedback From WBP Chairs Meeting

CM provided feedback on discussions about the £6M fund and the Wales Strategy Board Nature Recovery Plan.

There is still much confusion over the £6M fund. Strategy Board members were asked to provide ideas on no more than 1 side of A4. NRW produced a list of 25 grouped projects, which encompass NGO and partner activity. WG are holding 3 workshops on the fund apparently using a speed-dating format (dates available from WG) — NGOs and local authorities are encouraged to attend. It was agreed with WG that WBP Chairs or their representatives would attend. Places must be booked.

SB is submitting a number of initiatives (under discussion later). It was also suggested that the Swansea REF bid which, scored highly should be submitted

The Nature Recovery Plan (Biodiversity Strategy) outline caused concern at the meeting. MQ reluctantly agreed to include habitat restoration as opposed to only habitat creation following discussion (this is an EU target!). The WBP groups also questioned the omission of SSSIs from the paper, the NGOs have already raised this at the Strategy Board.

### 2. REF Fund Update

- South Wales Wildlife Sites Project

#### 3. WBP Evidence Gaps

The Research Gaps list and completed project proposals for each Ecosystem Group and SEG are available on the WBP website. Tracey Lovering is coordinating the project with the universities and the list and proposals are updated monthly.

Three Project proposals for LGHEG are already live. The group needs to identify further strategic priorities if appropriate and develop outline project briefs in the format provided.

No lowland grassland research needs have been identified at present but SS has some ideas for research priorities.

## 4. Fire Management Training, Biochar etc.

Sion has submitted 2 project ideas to WG -

- 1) Common Land Fire Management this programme of work will engage with commoners to reduce grass fires across Wales through training a distributed network of farmer trainers to interpret the Heather and Grass Burning code, to produce fire plans and to carry out controlled burning training with the support of partner agencies. The group was very supportive of the project similar attempts to provide training in the past have not received sufficient support but the Move towards a more holistic approach linking management for nature conservation to costs of countryside fire to society is likely to be more favourable within WG new agenda.
- 2) Biochar production from invasive species, plant health operations (Rhododendron, Larch and Ash) and biodiversity 'wastes' The purpose of this initiative is to pilot mobile fast-pyrolysis technology for the production of biochar from biodiversity and forestry plant health operations whilst producing a high-value product that will contribute sustainably to the low-carbon economy of Wales, contributing a market derived income steam for onward investment in ecosystem management. Sion is meeting with Snowdonia National Park in November to talk about rhododendron pyrolysis (JS will attend).

The Swansea Ref project was also discussed although this did not receive funding it scored very highly and the group felt it was worth putting forward for the £6m pot as it included a lot of elements which
